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Recovery Court

- ❖ Recovery Courts are the most effective justice interventions for treating drug-addicted people. Recovery Courts **REDUCE DRUG USE**. Recovery Courts **REDUCE CRIME**. Recovery Courts **SAVE MONEY**. Recovery Courts **RESTORE LIVES**. Recovery Courts **SAVE CHILDREN AND RE-UNITE FAMILIES**.
- ❖ Eligible drug-addicted persons may be sent to Recovery Court in lieu of traditional justice system case processing. Recovery Courts keep individuals in treatment long enough for it to work, while supervising them closely

Front-End Intervention and Treatment (FIT)

- ❖ 9 to 24-month voluntary program explicitly tailored to non-violent offenders for whom substance abuse is a contributing factor in their criminal activity
- ❖ Addresses the criminogenic needs of offenders based on their risk level
- ❖ Addresses the offender's thought processes through a cognitive thinking program (CBT)
- ❖ Allows for diversion of criminal charges or jail time while receiving treatment and services
- ❖ Case management supervision and treatment plan dependent on risk level, needs, performance, and compliance

Pretrial Monitoring

- ❖ Pretrial Services provides information to the court to assist them in the pretrial release decision using a Risk Assessment. Pretrial Services monitors individuals released to the community pending future court appearances.
- ❖ If ordered to pretrial monitoring, the defendant will remain on monitoring until their court case reaches final disposition. Defendants must comply with the conditions of monitoring while awaiting disposition.

Front-End Intervention and Treatment OWI

- ❖ 9 to 30-month voluntary program explicitly tailored to OWI 3rd and 4th offenses
- ❖ Addresses the criminogenic needs of offenders based on their risk level
- ❖ Case management supervision and treatment plan dependent on risk level, needs, performance, and compliance

Diversion Programs

❖ First Time Offender Program

- A diversion program created to divert individuals who have never been in trouble before, with the intention of keeping them out of the criminal justice system. If the program is completed, the offense will not go on their permanent record.
- The requirements to complete this program are one class in person, an additional online education course if applicable,

and to stay offense-free for the duration of the program and 60 days after the class is completed.

❖ THC Diversion Program

- Diversion program for individuals with THC-related offenses whose charges have been referred to the District Attorney's Office.
- Voluntary program offered to individuals who do not want a criminal charge.

❖ Check Diversion Program

- Recover full restitution for worthless checks and return to the victim as soon as possible.
- Educate defendants to prevent repeated worthless checks.
- Divert lower-risk offenders and offenses out of the criminal justice system
- Reduce recidivism

COMPAS Assessment

- ❖ A tool that focuses on predictors known to affect recidivism
- ❖ Identify the risk of re-offense
- ❖ Identify the needs of the participant
